Dear Friends of Chesapeake Chamber Music:

It is my privilege to report on the past year's activities and financial affairs of Chesapeake Chamber Music.

Our Chamber Music Festival in June held thirteen concerts over two weeks for almost 1100 attendees. Artistic directors, J. Lawrie Bloom and Marcy Rosen, assembled a group of extraordinary musicians, a mixture of old and new faces, who played a full and varied selection of wonderful music for our enjoyment. In a special new offering, the festival was opened by an organ and trumpet concert at St. Mark's Church. How blessed we are to continue to have, as we have had for twenty-six years, such extraordinary music at our Festival!

In early September, Jazz on the Chesapeake held three concerts for over 650 attendees, a significant increase over last year. Artistic Director Monty Alexander and the Jazz Committee led by Al Sikes put on a wonderful jazz-filled Labor Day weekend. Monty's concert was, as usual, the high spot. There were many new faces. The addition of the Salute to Charlie Byrd concert featuring the Chuck Redd Ensemble proved especially popular.

Mardi Gras Live!, our annual fund raising gala in March led by Jean McHale, was attended by almost 250 people who raised significant funds for CCM and had a wonderful time to boot.

In this past year our YouthReach First Strings program provided violin lessons to every third grader in Talbot County and to most in Dorchester County. We have begun a follow-up program, Presto!, for 4th graders. In addition, for the first time, we provided a musical assembly program to elementary school students in both of these counties which was received with enthusiasm.


